The Opportunities

CEE presents exciting opportunities for British companies across the nuclear supply chain spectrum, market opportunities for the region are estimated at over £40 billion.

Hungary currently has 4 operating VVER reactors at Paks, which will be expanded with the addition of two new reactors, ready for operation between 2025 and 2030 (£10 billion project). A near-surface radwaste repository will be decommissioned in the coming years.

Other potential opportunities across the region include Romania's £5.5 billion project for the construction of 2 new CANDU reactors at Cernavoda, life extension work on Unit 1 and the construction of a low and intermediate level waste repository are scheduled to start in the next 5 years. Poland envisages 6,000 MWe of nuclear power to come online by 2035. In Bulgaria, £400 million worth of decommissioning work is being tendered for reactors 1 to 4 at Kozloduy NPP and a waste disposal facility. Other countries, such as Slovakia and the Czech Republic present new build and maintenance opportunities. Czech Republic has two NPPs – Temelin and Dukovany with two reactors on each location. Current plans intend to expand by two new reactors.
